Dear friends

This month I'm going to do my best to refrain from focusing on Harvest: we'll be celebrating God's gifts to us through Creation on 1st October, so I'm going in a different direction now instead. Although it's still early autumn, as the crops, fruit and veg are all 'safely gathered in' and the leaves begin to die away, it becomes



the natural time of year for reflection on all that has past. For me, early October is always a time of acknowledgement rather than celebration, but this year perhaps I'm celebrating rather than just acknowledging as this month marks 15 years of ordained ministry for me. One of my cohort at theological college reminded me a while ago that somewhere along the line I'd said that we would be liminal priests since the Church was facing a time of change. I barely remember saying this, but it may have stemmed from the fact that the group of 12 were 10 women and 2 men, indicating a swing away from such a historically male-dominated vocation. My prophecy turned out to be true and as I reflect on my ministry so far; things have changed in ways that we could never have imagined. Not only are women well and truly part of the priesthood now, we also have women bishops. As typical students (in our final year, I seem to remember), we all donned purple tee shirts with a slogan that reflected a well-known mobile 'phone provider at the time: The future's bright: the future's purple. That feels like a century ago and since then I've woken up to what ministry is about. Yes, it's about serving both God and neighbour, but it's also about fire-fighting, that is, peacekeeping in communities where people often have very different opinions and theologies, and it's about weathering personal attacks. Over my 15 years I've been stalked, verbally and almost physically attacked by a racist, hauled over the coals via the internet for trying to tidy up a church yard that violated every rule the Archdeacon could find, and if I had a pound for every hateful email received, I'd be a very rich lady! That was all in the Church of England. My time with the Church in Wales has had its moments too. Very soon after arriving in Bridgend the pandemic was upon us. That meant working very differently and learning to minister online, and I'm afraid, while everyone else seemed to be making their homes pristine and taking up new hobbies, the clergy were working harder than ever to keep the churches functioning. I admit to being quite jealous of having no time to do such things. I now regard those years as 'missing' and in a sense, I grieve for them. Yet in the middle of the trials and tribulations of life and ministry, there have been moments of glorious

sunshine: people deepening their faith, exploring vocations, celebrating weddings and baptisms, schools wanting to engage and make links with the churches, and most recently, everyone across the new Ministry Area realising that we're all quite nice people, actually, other churches are different, but as beautiful and special as our 'home' church, and everything feared by the formation of MA has turned out OK. There are still the ongoing problems of finances, not enough clergy and fluctuating numbers of members, but the Church is still here. May we all learn to be as generous with our personal gifts and talents as God has been generous to us us in his great provision so that the Church in Bridgend may grow, flourish and have fruit to harvest.

#### September

Green your home this Autumn. Tackle climate change and reduce your heating bill by testing how draughty

or leaky your home is. Find the gaps that let the cold air in and warm air out (think keyholes, letterboxes, gaps around the edges or bottoms of windows and doors, loft hatches, floorboards etc.) and fix these gaps using the correct materials: (there are lots of handy tutorials on how to do this online). Now is also a very good time to prepare for winter by sticking tinfoil or radiator panels between the wall and radiator, as these will help reflect heat back into your room during the colder months.

#### October

Provide food and shelter for wildlife, now and in preparation for next year. Clean all your bird feeders to avoid the spread of disease to winter migrants and put up a nest box well in advance of breeding season. A nest box could also prove a cosy spot for small birds to spend the night on particularly cold winter evenings ahead.

#### **Bridgend County Borough Council News**

#### Porthcawl's new promenade and flood defence work officially opened

A £6.4m scheme which will help to defend Porthcawl from flooding and any potential future rise in sea levels has been officially opened.

The work was jointly funded by Welsh Government and Bridgend County Borough Council as part of the Coastal Risk Management Programme. Construction specialists Knights Brown have transformed the promenade area into a flat, easily accessible space with new planters and enhanced flood defences which blend into the overall design and run between Porthcawl Marina and Coney Beach.

The promenade was officially opened by Welsh Government's Deputy Minister for Climate Change, Lee Waters MS and the Leader, Cllr Huw David. The work also focused on the iconic Western Breakwater and extensive refurbishment was required to ensure that the 200-year-old structure can continue to stand up to the tides and tough maritime weather conditions. Around 550 tonnes of grout was used during the upgrade. The second phase of the project extended into Sandy Bay and as far as Rhych Point, where flood defences and dune protection works were also upgraded.

Deputy Minister for Climate Change, Lee Waters said, "We've suffered devastating flooding and weather conditions over the past few years, which has affected communities across Wales.

"We're helping to safeguard those areas at risk through our Coastal Risk Management Programme, and it was good to see how homes and businesses will benefit from Porthcawl's latest flood scheme."

Cllr John Spanswick, Cabinet Member for Climate Change and the Environment, said: "It's really pleasing to work with Welsh Government on this important scheme which will help to benefit the local community for generations to come.

"This project forms a vital part of the infrastructure for defending the town against flooding and key stakeholders who continue to live, work, visit and invest in the area will be reassured by the quality of the upgrade."
