Dear friends

I wonder whether you've made any New Year's resolutions this year? If you're now trying to lose excess pounds after the Christmas feasting or vowing to take more exercise, then all the very best to you! Making any kind of change is hard work and requires determination. When it comes to discipleship, we



might also be thinking of praying more, reading the Bible more, or even doing these things for the first time. Again, all the very best to you with your efforts. But perhaps I may suggest something really EASY as a resolution that anyone and everyone can do?

A short while ago, the Rev'd Roger and I participated in a course on evangelism. This was the ACORN course and as it was only going to be for an hour over 2 or 3 weeks, plus it was online so we didn't have to travel anywhere, there wasn't much effort involved. The background to this begins with the simple fact that offering a warm welcome in our churches isn't enough, and is based on statistics that noted that out of participants on other mission-based courses, 70% of them said that they had a person in mind to invite to church. The statistics revealed that 50% of those had no intention of inviting them.

The ACORN course was formed with this in mind: why were people NOT following their thoughts through? When pressed, the answer had its roots in fear (of being rejected, laughed at, never spoken to again, etc, etc), yet there are at least two Biblical reasons why we should fear the fear and do it anyway: how many times does it say in the Bible, 'Do not be afraid? 365 (ie, one prompt for every day); and in the Parable of the Talents we're reminded of our need to obey in order to grow so that one day we hear the words, 'Well done, good and faithful servant.' Note that the words aren't, 'Well done, good and successful servant.'

In the ACORN course, success means one person invites one other person to church and then leaves the rest to God, who is, after all, the One who gives the growth, not us. So, the suggestion is to pray this one prayer: Lord, is there someone you want me to connect with outside the church family? Just wait for the nudge, then ACT on it.

ACORN is an acronym:

Ask (for a person to connect with),
Call (everyone is called to do this);
Obey (follow the nudge);
Report (share what happens with others) and
Notice (what God has done).

Simple. And I really wouldn't ask you to do something that I wouldn't be prepared to do myself!

Thieves target local cemeteries and disrupt water supplies

South Wales Police and Bridgend County Borough Council are urging residents to remain alert and to report any suspicious behaviour they may witness when visiting local cemeteries.

It follows a series of thefts in which sexton's huts and maintenance outbuildings at five council-maintained cemeteries have been broken into. The thieves, who appear to be targeting metal items, have vandalised and damaged the cemeteries while attempting to gain access before removing pipes, taps and more.

This has left the cemeteries without a water supply, which has caused issues for mourners and grieving families who have been visiting to pay their respects and tend to graves.
