Dear friends

How is Lent going for you this year? There are still a few weeks until Easter, so it's not too late to get back on track and re-evaluate your spiritual life and your charitable giving.



Are you groaning? It's hard these days to give things up when we've suffered and are continuing to suffer

the high cost of living and fuel, isn't it? It's also difficult to change our spiritual habits of a lifetime and with Lent already underway, you may feel it's not the right time to do something new.

BUT, this **is** the season for making sacrifices as we walk through the wilderness with Christ and so I'm going to offer you a few practical (and easy) suggestions.

Several years ago, I was the recipient of a 'random act of kindness'. One of my parishioners at the time had taken the 40 Day Challenge and I was the very blessed person to anonymously receive a voucher for a meal out for two. Delightful! Not so long ago when we were on a cruise holiday, someone randomly attached a homemade gift to our cabin door. It was a crocheted mug warmer. Again, delightful! It can really make a change to someone's day to receive something unexpected, so here are just 14 ways in which to make a difference and spread a little happiness which can count as almsgiving without costing you anything other than time. And, as we know, time is spelt L-O-V-E.

- 1. Drink more water. It's easier to be kind when you feel healthy and energetic
- 2. Tell someone how much you love them
- 3. Go without a meal and remember what it's like to feel hungry
- 4. Make eye contact and smile at everyone you meet (strangers too)
- 5. Give someone a genuine compliment
- 6. Offer a helping hand to a neighbour
- 7. Leave something nice on a neighbour's doorstep
- 8. Write a list of at least 5 things that you're grateful for and thank God for those things
- 9. Make a real effort to save on your electricity/gas use
 - 10. Recycle something made of paper
 - 11. Clear a cupboard and give something away
- 12. Ring someone to say that you're thinking and praying for them
- 13. Say the Lord's Prayer on waking and on retiring to bed
- 14. Make a real effort NOT to complain about anything

Jesus himself assumes that we have a regular practice of giving alms, praying and fasting (see Matt. 6. 1-6, 16-21); it's not just something for Lent, but it's a good opportunity to start, so see how just doing 14 acts of kindness towards others and the planet changes you – and keep doing them!

Sunday 25 th February (Second Sunday of Lent)	Psalm 22. 23- 31	You who fear the Lord, praise him! All you offspring of Jacob, glorify him; stand in awe of him, all you offspring of Israel! For he did not despise or abhor the affliction of the afflicted; he did not hide his face from me, but heard when I cried to him. From you comes my praise in the great congregation; my vows I will pay before those who fear him. The poor shall eat and be satisfied; those who seek him shall praise the Lord. May your hearts live for ever! All the ends of the earth shall remember and turn to the Lord; and all the families of the nations shall worship before him. For dominion belongs to the Lord, and he rules over the nations. To him, indeed, shall all who sleep in the earth bow down; before him shall bow all who go down to the dust, and I shall live for him. Sunday 3 rd March (Third Sunday of Lent)	Psalm 19	To the leader. A Psalm of David. The heavens are telling the glory of God; and the firmament proclaims his handiwork. Day to day pours forth speech, and night to night declares knowledge. There is no speech, nor are there words; their voice is not heard; yet their voice goes out through all the earth, and their words to the end of the world.
		In the heavens he has set a tent for the sun, which comes out like a bridegroom from his wedding canopy, and like a strong man runs its course with joy. Its rising is from the end of the heavens, and its circuit to the end of them; and nothing is hidden from its heat.

A natural haven set to be developed at Heol-y-Cyw

Facilitated by Welsh Government's Local Places for Nature funding and the partnership between the Bridgend Local Nature Partnership, Bridgend County Borough Council and Coychurch Higher Community Council, a new space for nature and the community is set to be developed at Heol-y-Cyw playing field.

The scheme includes the creation of new habitat involving wet woodland, wildflowers, and an area of wetland. The wetland will be created by directing existing surface water to an attenuation pond, not only to improve the conditions of the field, but also to provide a valuable wetland habitat for a range of species, such as bats, amphibians, birds, and invertebrates.

The £150,000 project will also include benches, picnic benches, a new path, and a boardwalk over the wetland area. The scheme will also feature artwork from sculptor, Will Nash, in the form of a bee column, which will provide vital nesting opportunities for solitary bees. The initiative will support this species, which does not swarm or belong to colonies, but is a very important pollinator.

Cabinet Member for Climate Change and Environment, Cllr John Spanswick, said: "We welcome the development of this area, which promises to offer sanctuary for both wildlife and people wanting to enjoy the natural environment – the perfect antidote to the fast-paced culture in which we live.

"Currently, there are around 250 species of the solitary bee in the UK and the space offers support in helping them to thrive. We would like to thank Welsh Government and our partners for allowing the playing field at Heol-y-Cyw to be cultivated in a way that has an abundance of environmental benefits, as well as advantages for wellbeing. We would like to reassure residents that the planting scheme will not be taking up all of the open space, the area will still feature two pitches and there will still be plenty of recreational ground for any informal activity. We are also currently working closely with Heol-y-Cyw RFC and are discussing a possible Community Asset Transfer at the playing fields, should the rugby club wish to pursue this, and if funding opportunities become available."

10,000 trees to be planted in the Ogmore Valley to tackle climate change and habitat loss As part of the council's commitment to responding to climate change and habitat loss, it will be planting 10,000 trees at Aber Fields in the Ogmore Valley, known locally as the Planka.

The scheme, which started today (15 February), is a phased programme of works involving tree planting, wildflower meadow and wet land creation and the removal of non-native species.

The first phase will involve planting over 5,000 native tree species, starting within the current planting season in February 2024.

As a result of these works, the scheme will create a more ecologically diverse area, promote habitat connectivity and benefit species in the Ogmore Valley. The works are being funded through Bridgend County Borough Council and Welsh Government's Local Places for Nature Fund.

The other phases of the scheme will scheduled in subsequent years/seasons and subject to finances.
