Dear friends

There is a song from the 1980's by a pop group called Foreigner. It is called "I want to know what love is" To love another is a difficult thing - especially when our experience of love is flawed, especially when we are unaware of how much we are loved, and most especially when our experience is of anger or



bitterness or resentment towards others for what they have done.

To really love another we need a standard or guide to follow and within that standard or guide - we need help - help to not only know what love is - but to know that the love we need is within us; that it is embracing us and has the power to embrace others through us, especially to embrace those others towards who we do not feel love.

"Love the Lord your God with all your heart and soul and strength and mind, and love your neighbour as yourself."

These commands, Jesus and The Prophets said summarize the Law, the law which Jesus says will not pass away until all is accomplished.

To that law, that law which can be most difficult for us to keep – Jesus added one commandment, and one commandment only during the three years of his ministry. The commandment given by Jesus as Judas departs from the Last Supper to betray him to his death.

"A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this all will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another."

And he said this knowing that the people he loved and trusted most were soon going to inflict heart wrenching pain on him. Judas would betray him but, Peter and the Apostles were going to desert him, abandon him and deny him.

In Rev. Maggie's January letter New Years resolutions were mentioned. If you like me and many others have not been able to keep yours already, then instead of giving up try taking up instead. Taking up for Lent His commandment <u>for</u> ourselves and saying:

Funding for forest schools to boost children's wellbeing

Bridgend County Borough Council has been awarded £400k of Welsh Government funding to create outdoor forest schools in eight primary schools across the county borough.



The funding is part of a larger £2m Community Focused Schools Grant offered by Welsh Government to increase community use of schools. From 2023 to 2025, the funding will support a variety of projects in schools throughout Bridgend County Borough, with establishing forest schools being one of those ventures. Selected schools to host the outdoor learning provision are across the county borough:

- Archdeacon John Lewis Church in Wales Primary School, Brackla.
- Bettws Primary School and Ysgol Gynradd Gymraeg Calon Y Cymoedd (shared provision), in the Garw Valley.
- Pîl Primary School, in Pyle.
- Llangynwyd Primary School, in the Llynfi Valley.
- Ogmore Vale Primary School, in the Ogmore Valley.
- Croesty Primary School, Pencoed.
- Nottage Primary School, Porthcawl.
- Tondu Primary School, in Aberkenfig.

The forest school provision is to be used by the schools, internal local authority organisations, and external community organisations. The aim is to promote outdoor learning and wellbeing, as well as encourage people to spend more time outdoors and experience the benefits of being in the natural world.

The natural environment and learning outdoors play a significant role in the new Curriculum for Wales. Sue Williams, Team Leader for Health, Education and Natural Resources said: "We are thrilled that being outdoors is now recognised as equal to the indoor classroom, and outdoor learning is positioned as a central pedagogy [teaching method] which all settings will engage in."

The new curriculum covers all learners aged three to 16 and was first implemented in September 2022 for all primary schools, and for Year 7 in some secondary schools. Since September 2023, all Year 7 and 8 pupils are taught through the new curriculum with a continuing roll out each year, until Year 11 are included by 2026.

Cllr Jon Paul Blundell, Cabinet Member for Education, said: "What a wonderful way for our schools to move forward and embrace the new Curriculum for Wales. Research shows how learning outdoors can lead to high levels of wellbeing, confidence and engagement, along with social, emotional and physical development. A forest school consultant has met with each of the named schools and is currently working on concept drawings. The consultant will continue to work closely with the schools to plan, establish and develop their grounds to create the forest schools. We are very grateful for this Welsh Government funding, enabling us to offer this outdoor provision to our learners and wider communities."



Budget settlement news prompts warning over council services

News that Bridgend County Borough Council is set to receive a 2024-25 budget settlement increase of 3 per cent has led the authority to warn that it is now impossible to avoid major changes for some council services.



As the settlement is below the current UK inflation and represents an increase in funding of £7.4m against known budget pressures of £28m, the council will need to take urgent action if it is to meet its legal obligation of delivering a fully balanced budget for the year ahead.

Cllr Hywel Williams, Cabinet Member for Resources, said: "For 13 consecutive years, local councils have been forced to make cuts and deliver savings as a result of experiencing the full impact of national austerity measures combined with Brexit, the global pandemic, increased costs, additional customer demand, and the ongoing cost of living crisis.

Food and energy bills for public buildings such as schools and day care centres have risen, higher numbers of vulnerable children and adults now require essential care and support, and councils have to meet the additional cost of salary and pension increases for teachers and other staff.

Similarly, the cost of materials for works ranging from constructing new schools or maintaining existing infrastructure such as the highways network have all significantly increased, and since March 2020, we have seen a 237 per cent increase in demand for temporary accommodation for homeless households.

National media is full of stories warning that this situation has now reached breaking point, and that there is a real risk of one in five English councils and a quarter of Scottish councils effectively going bankrupt in the next two years.

Bridgend County Borough Council is not immune to these challenges, and having already done everything we can to protect local residents from experiencing the brunt of cuts over the last 13 years, we are now at a stage where this is no longer possible.

While we will, of course, ensure that all of our funding is used effectively and efficiently, we should also all be prepared to make some particularly hard and unavoidable decisions before the council's final budget is agreed for 2024-25."

The Leader, Cllr Huw David added: "While a glance at the news headlines will tell you that this is a national problem, not just a local issue, research by the Welsh Governance Centre has highlighted that Welsh Government has received nearly £800m less in funding for 2024-25 – a total loss of £1.5bn in real terms and after accounting for inflation.

"This is clearly bad news for local government. As a council, we provide more than 800 different services that range from education, social care for children and older people and supporting the homeless through to implementing regeneration projects, undertaking school modernisation programmes and much, much more.

We already face huge financial pressures in areas such as social services and home to school transport, so it is important to be entirely realistic about the fact that some very difficult decisions will need to be made for next year's budget. We are going to have to look very closely at everything we do, including the level and frequency of each service, and determine whether changes are necessary. That is why this year, more so than ever before, we need the residents of Bridgend County Borough to take part in our forthcoming budget consultation, and to tell us where you think our resources should be prioritised.

New mural unveiled to 'give a voice' to care experienced teenagers in Bridgend County Borough

A striking, new mural has been unveiled in Bridgend town centre of a poem reflecting the voices of care experienced teenagers in Bridgend County Borough.



A former Children's Laureate Wales, Connor Allen, worked with care experienced teenagers, in a partnership facilitated by Foster Wales and Voices from Care Cymru, to create a piece of poetry sharing their life experiences, in the hope of educating people around the realities of fostering.

The aim of the poem, which has been brought to life in a distinctive mural created by local street artist and co-founder of Peaceful Progress, Bryce Davies, is to raise awareness and challenge perceptions of care experienced teenagers in the county borough.

The group of young people, aged 11 plus, hope their poem, which has been displayed publicly at Brackla Street in the town centre, will encourage people to consider fostering older children and teens in their local authority. Recent government statistics state that there are currently nearly 5,000 children in foster care across Wales and 53 per cent of those are children aged 11 and over. Many of these young people have faced extreme hardship and adversity, and yet when asked, it's the negative perceptions of wider society that hurt them most.

Molly^{*}, aged 14, from Bridgend, who co-wrote the poem, shares her experience of being a looked-after person: "Having a foster carer who sees through false perceptions and recognises my past but still continues to support and encourage me to make positive steps forward is helpful for my wellbeing."

The council's Deputy Leader and Cabinet Member for Social Services and Health, Cllr Jane Gebbie, said: "We are delighted that this collaboration has reflected the thoughts and feelings of our young people in such a creative way. Thank you to everyone involved in this project, particularly our young people who have shared their experiences with us to help raise awareness of the positives and dispel some of the myths around fostering teenagers."

Alastair Cope, Head of Foster Wales, says there are many benefits to fostering a young person aged 11 plus: "In many ways, teenagers in care are easier than fostering younger children. They have more understanding of what's going on in their lives, and able to do things on their own. They need involvement in decision making and a place where their voices can be heard, support, a mentor, someone to stand by them, advocate for them and champion them."

Emma Phipps-Magill, Operations Director, Voices from Care Cymru, adds: "Young people want to strip away these labels that have been given to them and just been seen as a teenager, and with the right support, thrive just like their non-care experienced peers. That's why this project with Foster Wales is so important, because it gives them a voice and it's helping to challenge these negative perceptions."
